## Two More Habitat Families Receive Keys to New Home

**Winnipeg, MANITOBA –** Today, Habitat for Humanity Manitoba (Habitat Manitoba) handed over the keys to another two Habitat families today at the Pandora Avenue West development in Transcona.

The Pandora Avenue West development is the largest and most ambitious project Habitat Manitoba has ever embarked upon, which will house approximately 275 people, including 175 children. This project is a beacon of hope for families caught in the housing crisis. 15 families have already moved into their homes and we look forward to welcoming another 18 families in 2025, and in 2026 we are scheduled to complete the final 20 homes.

Volunteers including our Board of Directors, donors, sponsors, families and staff have worked tirelessly to make this important moment possible. These homes will provide stability and security for these families through Habitat's affordable homeownership program, offering families an opportunity to purchase a safe and decent home through a unique financing partnership.

Habitat's path to homeownership is an involved and in-depth process that requires hard work, time and commitment by the future homeowners, all of which helps to strengthen their long-term success.
